# KEYNOTES

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**FYI:** The *Keynotes* has three objectives – to give the membership an overview of the Board activities, to provide information about activities, and to highlight issues important to the members. Comments are welcome.

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**Reminder: The Driftwood Key Club Annual Members' meeting is scheduled for Aug. 30th 2008 at 11am.**

On the agenda will be summary reports of the year's activities, a financial report, election results, and member concerns.

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## Treasurer's Report – Bill Cummings

I have mentioned for several months the shortage of reserves for the Operating Fund. The recent invoice for this fund was for \$172 per year per member. This amount was set in 2001, and has sufficed for 7 years. This year the Board has asked approval of an increase of \$102 per member, which, if approved by the membership on a forthcoming ballot, will raise dues for this fund to \$274/ member.

The Operating Fund pays for all the operations and maintenance of DKC facilities except for those which are associated with the Marina and harbor and expenses associated with the acquisition and maintenance of major capital equipment.

I urge members to attend Mike Bookey's briefing about the budget on July 26<sup>th</sup> at 10 A.M. You really should also look over the PowerPoint presentation Mike has made available on the Driftwood Key web site ([www.driftwoodkey.org](http://www.driftwoodkey.org)). Mike begins with a summary of the elements that comprise the Operating Fund (a simple way to find all that the fund covers, which is a lot and then shows the history of the fund and its elements since 2003). Then, if you go from the PowerPoint presentation and download the associated analytical model, you can see what the effect of the increase is for any increment you choose to input. You can also enter levels of inflation (any you choose) to analyze the effect of the economy on DKC operations. I think you'll be able to see why the Board chose the \$8.50/ month (\$102 per year) value. The fund transitions from the current marginal level with no reserve beyond a month or two into the new fiscal year, to a point where the reserve begins to build. Then

you can see that as inflation eats away at the reserve from year to year, we will ultimately need to request another increase. It is truly a wonderful innovation that virtually eliminates guesswork from the decision-making process. We chose to anticipate a 3.5% inflation rate. (Many economists are warning it will be considerably higher.)

While the model takes much of the guesswork out of the decision-making process, it cannot predict the unforeseeable. (Unavoidable litigation is an example). This is why any responsible management association is totally uncomfortable without some reserve. Pick the reserve level you think is sensible (attorneys are really expensive, propane for the pool and clubhouse a little less so, but conceivably five figures), and then compare it with the Board's request. Remember, in this simulation, that you cannot easily acquire additional funds whenever you find you need them. You must be able to acquire needed assets within 90 days or so, so you cannot just go the membership and request an additional assessment whenever you find you are running short. Voting on assessments and dues increases is time-consuming, labor intensive and expensive.

There are three other funds that fund the activities, functions and capital assets of Driftwood Key. We have spent so much time and space on the Operating Fund that I think the other three funds may have gotten overlooked. I will address these funds next month. They are somewhat simpler to get your arms around.

Don't miss Mike's presentation and enjoy working with his model.

Next Pot Luck will be Saturday, August 30 and there will be a special Ice Cream Sundae provided for dessert. Social Hour is at 5 pm and dinner is served at 6. This is a perfect opportunity to meet new neighbors and catch up on news from old neighbors. Bring a dish (a salad, main dish or dessert) to share and your own beverage of choice. Non-alcohol punch, coffee and tea are provided. Although we are always grateful for the abundance of help at each pot luck, we try to encourage everyone to stay and visit after dinner, so don't rush off. See you there.

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## Long Range Planning – Dennis Augustine

The long range planning committee hasn't met formally in the month of June, however things on the playground are moving along very well. Steve Lindberg and Gary Edin found a playground at a Seattle School that was being removed due to a building expansion. They went over, inspected it, talked to the manufacturer and the school and it meets all ASTM requirements for certified playground equipment.

Steve and Gary were able to acquire \$30,000 worth of equipment for just \$3,000 and transported it back to DWK and it is in storage awaiting fund raising and refurbishing before it is installed. We have the names of certified inspectors who will make sure that it is installed properly so children will be safe in using it.

Fund raising efforts continue and we will be accepting cash donations at the DWK fishing derby on July 19. If you forget your checkbook we have pledge forms available and remember ALL of the proceeds from the sale of food and beverage at the derby will go to the Playground refurbishment fund. This fund is a restricted fund and all funds raised can only go to the purchase, construction and maintenance of the playground.

Our second fund raising effort for the playground will be the DWK garage sale happening on August 30 at the clubhouse. All revenue from the donated items sold will go the playground fund too.

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## Storm water

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## Board of Trustees Meeting Summary – July 10, 2008

The **Treasurer's Report** for June was submitted. A motion to ask the members to approve the budget for 2008-2009 as written with the operating dues increase of \$8.50 per month and presented in June was approved.

Some of the equipment for the new and improved **playground** has been purchased. Planning and fundraising continue. **Dock** maintenance and repair plans and activities are ongoing. **Dredging** can be completed in November, all within the previously approved budget. There will be a **fundraising garage sale** this Labor Day. T-shirts and beverages will be available for purchase. Collection of sale items will be at the clubhouse on July 26, Aug 9, and Aug 23. Proceeds from sale go toward the playground project. The **Governance** focus group continues its review of the Articles of Incorporation (Art. 2&3), while the committee is rewriting a proposed set of bylaws. Gene asked the Board to inspect some photos of possible view obstructions and try to determine if these were true **view obstructions**. Although the Club cannot act on view

obstructions on developed property, home owners can. The Club can, with a court order, require **lot clearing** on vacant lots. The Club needs to work on a definition of "view". Legal action should have the consensus of the community. **Nominees** approved for the election are Frank Fox, Brad Luton, and Christine McClellan. Members are urged to check out the 2008-09 **budget** presentation on the website [www.driftwoodkey.org](http://www.driftwoodkey.org) and try out the interactive spreadsheet. One presentation at the clubhouse was presented July 8<sup>th</sup>; another was scheduled for Jul 26<sup>th</sup>.

Under **new business**, Bruce submitted proposed explanations of the ballots for budget approval and a bylaw amendment. Dennis Augustine announced that the budget and fundraising target for the playground is \$10K. Keynotes deadlines are 15<sup>th</sup> of the month to submit articles, 22<sup>nd</sup> to the office, 25<sup>th</sup> to print, and 26<sup>th</sup> to mail. After much discussion, the Board agreed to invite the Kitsap County Commissioner candidates to a forum in Mid-August.

### CANDIDATES' FORUM IN MID-AUGUST

#### Board of Trustees Meeting June 12, 2008

The meeting was called to order at 7:05pm. Board members present were Bill Buegel, Bruce O'Connor, Gene Borgomainerio, Bill Cummings, Mike Bookey, Jerry Matthewson, and Dennis Hardin. Following the Pledge of Allegiance the President suspended the order of the agenda to accommodate two guest's presentations.

Jim Fendrich, representing the Puget Sound Anglers North Kitsap Chapter, provided some details about the joint PSA and DKC Chinook Salmon Derby on July 19, donating the net proceeds from the sale of food and beverages to the fund for playground equipment.

Member Doug Miller (Canal Lane) clarified an issue regarding the height of the house he is building and the deposit. Both issues were satisfactorily explained and the approval for construction was confirmed. Mr. Miller will provide a final set of plans.

The meeting agenda was confirmed and a quorum was confirmed.

Ilmar Lusi spoke to the fact that it is difficult for him to organize or sustain an Emergency Preparedness Committee without greater participation from the membership. He will call for the designated area coordinators to contact him. DKC will mail another call to have interested members step forward.

A Focus Group reviewing the Governance Committee's proposed Articles of Incorporation reported through Steve Lindberg that there are 12 members in the group and that 9 or 10 members attend the Monday meetings. To date, the preamble, Article 1, and Article 2 para 1 thru 16 have been reviewed favorably, and the Group will meet sometime after July 15 with the Club's special counsel. Bill Cummings submitted the monthly Treasurer's Report. Mike Bookey presented a proposed budget for Board review. In summary, Club total budget operating expenses are \$138,675 and a fixed income for operations of \$103,176. After much discussion of the details of the proposed budget, it was agreed that a budget-only meeting open to all members is needed. Dues billings will be mailed before the end of June. It was moved, seconded and approved to propose increasing budget operating member dues by \$8.50 per month. This increase will require member approval. It was moved, seconded and approved to amend the bylaws to raise the dues cap from \$172 to \$274 per year (also requires membership approval). The Secretary is required to send out a ballot on these budget issues.

Architectural Control (ACC) has given provisional approval for an 8' fence. Board members requested that this approval be rescinded because of provisions of the Protective Covenants.

Building and Grounds reports that the signs have been installed and that two picnic tables were installed.

Docks and Waterfronts presented two motions: 1) a marina lease rate increase of 10% as of July 1, 2008, needed to maintain marina reserve levels for replacement of the marina in the future; and 2) to sub-lease marina spaces. The lease rate increases were approved; the marina hot-berthing motion was disapproved. Bruce O'Connor has requested information regarding the history of the transfer of the marina and its accounts to Club ownership. Right now all moneys coming into the marina goes to the marina reserves.

Dredging funds are now paying interest on the loan; funds are available to cover the expenses to be incurred at the end of

November. \$411,278 of the loan is available; approximately \$158,000 will be required to complete the dredging and the required final surveys. Expense reports are available in the Club office. To date the club has spent \$986,276. There is a very narrow channel beyond the entry marker piles; Bill Buegel will contact the Coast Guard to see if additional markers can be installed.

There will be a rummage sale in September. Volunteers are available. One suggestion was to have the sale through-out the neighborhood with members donating the proceeds to the playground fund.

Governance reports that the Club bylaws are continuing to be reviewed. Policies and Procedures for several committees and the office of Vice-President need to be drafted and reviewed.

GHAAC representation shall continue and will not exist as a committee. Geno requests that the Board permit him to ask for assistance from GHAAC to lobby the County to upgrade the water mains in the area and install additional fire hydrants.

Keynotes deadline will be June 22.

Long Range Planning has volunteers who are willing to improve the playground area. Lou and Frances Graber have donated \$500 toward playground improvement.

Lot Clearing still has some issues that need to be resolved, but based on legal counsel opinion, the club needs to develop a comprehensive view protection policy. The Club will investigate the cost of getting a court order to clear brush and debris from vacant lots.

Nominating committee has three nominees willing to run for the board.

Policies and Procedures Committee needs a clear broad policy on clearing vacant lots.

The Pool Advisory reports that the civil rights specialist is unable to resolve the adult swim pool complaint. In recent correspondence the Club has been advised that the issue will probably end up in the State Attorney General's office and that some sort of compromise regarding a modified adult swim will be worked out.

Public Safety reports that there have been burglaries in the area. A report was filed with the County Sheriff's office. As these incidents occur members are encouraged to notify the office so that the community can build a case for action by the appropriate officials.

Dispute Resolution: Bill Buegel asks that the Board and members take action to develop a procedure for conflict resolution so that we don't have to resort to legal actions every time there is a dispute.

The club submitted an insurance claim for litigation expenses. These claims for the defense of the pending legal actions would be covered by insurance and that it should not affect our premiums because we have been claims-free for many years. Bill Buegel and/or Bill Cummings will be the contact on this issue.




The meeting was adjourned at 10:08pm.
