### Pool Advisory Committee

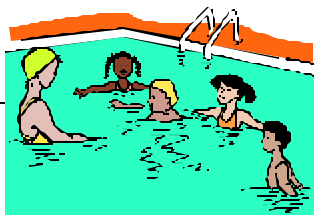

The Hansville Flotsam and Jetsam Garden Club will proudly be presenting \$4,200 to local residents in scholarships and grants at its June 10 luncheon.

Moshe Calm, a graduate of Kingston High School has been awarded \$1,000. He plans to attend Illinois Institute of Technology and major in chemical and biological engineering with a specialization in energy and environment.

Jessica Randall graduates from Kingston High and will receive \$1,000 toward her studies in marine biology. She is undecided as to which school she will be attending but has been accepted to 4 universities. She hopes to continue on for a Masters at James Cook University in Australia.

Thomas Jensen receives \$1,000, toward his education at Washington State University where he plans to major in soil science and work in soil conservation. He is graduating from North Kitsap.

Katelyn Rose graduates from North Kitsap and will receive \$1,000, toward her schooling at University of Alaska Southeast. She plans to major in marine biology and hopes to work in "preserving

and maintaining wildlife in the oceans."

Two \$200 grants are being awarded this year. Robin Alberts of Kingston High School submitted a request for funding to purchase bulbs to be planted on the school campus this fall. This is a project which will beautify the campus for many years to come and the garden club would be delighted to offer some help and advice as well as the grant.

The second \$200 grant goes to Hansville Co-op Preschool, and was submitted by Erica Whitbeck. She plans to involve students and parents as well as the teacher by developing a planter bed alongside the Buck Lake Community Center, which will be planted with vegetables and flowers. Her goal is to help children gain pride in their flowers and learn to grow edible items.

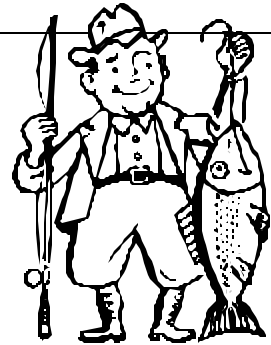

**Emergency Preparedness***by Jerry Ulsund*

When preparing for a possible emergency situation, it's best to think first about the basics of survival: **fresh water, food, clean air and warmth.**

**Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:**

- Water, one gallon of water per person, per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)

**Local maps****Additional Items to Consider Adding to an Emergency Supply Kit:**

- Prescription medications and glasses
- Infant formula and diapers
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a waterproof, portable container
- Cash or traveler's checks and change
- Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or information from [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov)
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person. Consider additional bedding if you live in a cold-weather climate
- Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes. Consider additional clothing if you live in a cold-weather climate.
- Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper – when diluted, nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners.
- Fire Extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates and plastic utensils, paper towels
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children
